### What's Gambling?

- Gambling is risking something of value on an event that is determined mostly by chance.
- A person is gambling if he or she puts up something of value, such as money or property.
- The outcome has an element of chance beyond the person's control.
- Once the bet is made, it's not reversible.

#### **Treatment for Gambling Disorder**

- · Motivational Interviewing empathy, self- efficacy
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy beliefs, fallacies
- Acceptance/Commitment, Mindfulness
- Brief Intervention
- Harm Reduction Reducing life-damaging consequences

#### Who's at Risk: Suicide

- Among those with gambling problems:
  - 38% suicidal ideation (SI)
  - 32% suicide attempt
  - SI leads to more gambling when gambling
  - SI+ PG = 5x more likely to have depression
  - PG + Drug history = 6x more likely attempt
  - 21% of attempters say it is gambling related

#### Who's at Risk: Intimate Partner Violence

- Study of 300 women, consecutive ER admissions (Muehlemann et al, 2002)
- 26% categorized as experiencing IPV
- IPV 10x's as likely if partner was problem gambler
- IPV 6x's as likely if partner was problem drinker
- IPV 50x's as likely if partner was both

#### **Ohio Adults' Gambling Prevalence**

- Of the 8.98 million Ohioans 18 and older, an estimated 6.72 million (74.9%) gamble, and an estimated 2.25 million (25.1%) do not gamble.
- Of those who gamble, an estimated 5.81 M (86.3% of gamblers; 64.6% of adults) gamble, but do not have risk factors for at-risk/problem gambling.
- An estimated 919,162 Ohioans can be categorized as low-risk, moderate-risk, or problem gamblers; **10.3% of the general population, or 13.7% of gamblers.**
- The prevalence of problem gambling is 0.9% which equates to an estimated 76,379 individuals in the target population of 8.98 million.


# **Prevalence of Gambling Nationally Compared to Ohio**


- National and state-to-state problem gambling prevalence studies show average rates of 2.2%.
- Ohio's gambling disorder rate is 0.9%
- Ohio's rate in 2012 was 0.4%
















## Ohio Healthy Youth Environments Survey Youth Ages 12-17 are Surveyed




#### **Gambling Behavior by Race & Ethnicity**




- "Other race" comprised Asian, American Indian and Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, Other, and multi-race.
- African American and Hispanic ethnicity individuals had higher rates of risk/problem gambling than White and "Other race" individuals.









## **Family History of Alcohol or Drug Problem**


 At-risk/problem gamblers were the most likely group to have someone else in their family with an alcohol or drug use problem.

STATEWIDE	Has anyone in your family EVER had an alcohol or drug problem?		
Gambling Status	Yes	No	
Non-Gambler	27.6%	72.4%	
Non-Problem Gambler	34.8%	65.2%	
At-Risk/Problem Gambler	47.6%	52.4%

## **Serious Depression**

 At-risk/problem gamblers were the group most likely to report being seriously depressed.

STATEWIDE	In the past 12 months, have you felt seriously depressed?		
Gambling Status	Yes	No	
Non-Gambler	15.0%	85.0%	
Non-Problem Gambler	14.2%	85.8%	
At-Risk/Problem Gambler	26.1%	73.9%
